1	<p><u>Protective Measures</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Minimise contact with individuals who are unwell by ensuring that those who have coronavirus (COVID-19) symptoms, or who have someone in their household who does, do not attend school. - Where recommended, use of face coverings in schools (ensure safe storage and disposal of face covering is considered). - Clean hands thoroughly more often than usual. 		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Clear procedure in place with information displayed and shared with everyone who enters the building, regarding the procedure for what to do if you are feeling unwell with Covid-19 symptoms. • Face coverings are not recommended in school owing to the age of children and the other options that are available to minimise risk for all stakeholders. • Clear hand cleaning routine in place and information shared with all staff – children to wash their hands every morning when they enter school, before and after play/lunch and before going home. • Staff can increase the amount of hand washing – for example if a child sneezes in their hand. • All bins in classrooms have lids with foot pedals. Plentiful supply of tissues and basic cleaning equipment placed in all classrooms. • Increased cleaning through school, additional cleaner employed to clean high contact and key areas through the day. • Clear routine in place for cleaning of classrooms and corridors on a daily basis. • Clear routines in place around school, areas such as toilets and photocopiers all have anti-bac wipes to use before and after use.

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	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- Ensure good respiratory hygiene by promoting the 'catch it, bin it, kill it' approach.- Introduce enhanced cleaning, including cleaning frequently touched surfaces often, using standard products such as detergents and bleach.- Minimise contact between individuals and maintain social distancing wherever possible.- Where necessary, wear appropriate personal protective equipment (PPE).		<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Staff advised on the importance of social distancing, to avoid using staff room where manageable.• Staffing planned to reduce contact across bubbles as much as is possible.• Basic PPE (face mask, gloves, apron) is available in school, particularly where staff may be dealing with first aid incidents).• Staff are now able to use lateral flow tests to reduce the risk of coming in to school when they may be carrying Covid-19.
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
